From the General Manager


As anyone who has lived in central Texas for any amount of time can tell you, drought is something we experience regularly. However, this year is different. It has been the hottest and driest spring and early summer in memory. The lack of rain has greatly impacted the water levels in the Barton Springs aquifer. Those levels are way below normal. This is where we get most of the water in our system. As a result, the Barton Springs Edwards Aquifer Conservation District (BSEACD) has declared Stage 2 water restrictions. That means we are required to reduce the pumping from our water wells by 20%. We will need every member of the Creedmoor Maha community to help meet these reductions.

Our members can help by limiting your lawn watering to one (1) time per week. Only wash vehicles at car washes where the water is recycled. If you have a swimming pool, please cover it during the hot times of the day and limit how often you refill it.

If everyone pitches in, I am sure we can meet these requirements and prevent further restrictions.

Pray for rain!

Looking to the Future

You may have seen crews out working in the trenches and ditches in the blistering heat and sometimes in the rain storms throughout our CMWSC CCN. Crews are either installing new water lines or repairing small or major water leaks.

When rain is scarce, the earth becomes very hard and can shift pipes that are installed underground up to five feet. Because of this shift in the earth, pipes can break or leak causing water loss. Sometimes, if large enough, the breaks in the pipes require emergency repairs. Our water pipes can be under the surface as deep as



10' or high as three feet due to other utilities lines sometimes requiring boring deep under the surface, as seen in these photos. Pipe sizes are being increased to provide better water pressure and capacity.

You may have also seen a lot of clearing of land on Laws Rd and Evelyn Rd. D.R. Horton is a developer that CMWSC has been working with for the past two years. It is expected that they will build close to 600 hundred homes within the next two to three years and in several phases. We anticipate construction and lane closures soon along these roads. We are excited about the growth in the area and the new homes that will be available to current and new customers.

CMWSC has been very busy as new developers will be hitting the ground within the next three to five years as well. In order for future growth, we will be laying 4.5 miles of new water pipes that will create a loop around our entire CCN system to provide water for the growth coming to the area. We are anticipating as many as 10,000 new homes in the next 15 years in the Mustang Ridge and Creedmoor,




TX cities. We serve water to customers in Bastrop, Caldwell, Hays, and Travis counties.

We are excited about the future of CMWSC and will keep you update on its progress.












