Creedmoor Maha WSC will have a display this year at the City of Creedmoor's Trail of Lights. The Trail of Lights will be officially open Friday, November 25, 2022. It is in the park behind the Creedmoor Community Center on FM 1625. Bring your kids to see Santa and enjoy all of the pretty lights.

I want to thank everyone who has done their part saving water this year. You have done a great job and we have met all of the Stage 2 Drought requirements. Unfortunately, we have not had enough rain to get us out of this drought.

Barton Springs Edwards Aquifer Conservation District (BSEACD) has now declared Stage 3 Drought restrictions. That means we need to cut back an additional 10% on our water usage for a total of 30%. Fortunately, most people's water usage goes down this time of year. We don't need to water grass or gardens as often and swimming pools are put away for the year. I know with a little more effort we will meet our Stage 3 Critical Drought restrictions.

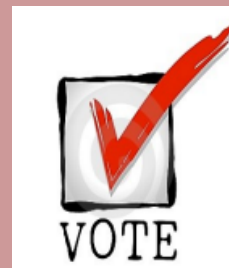

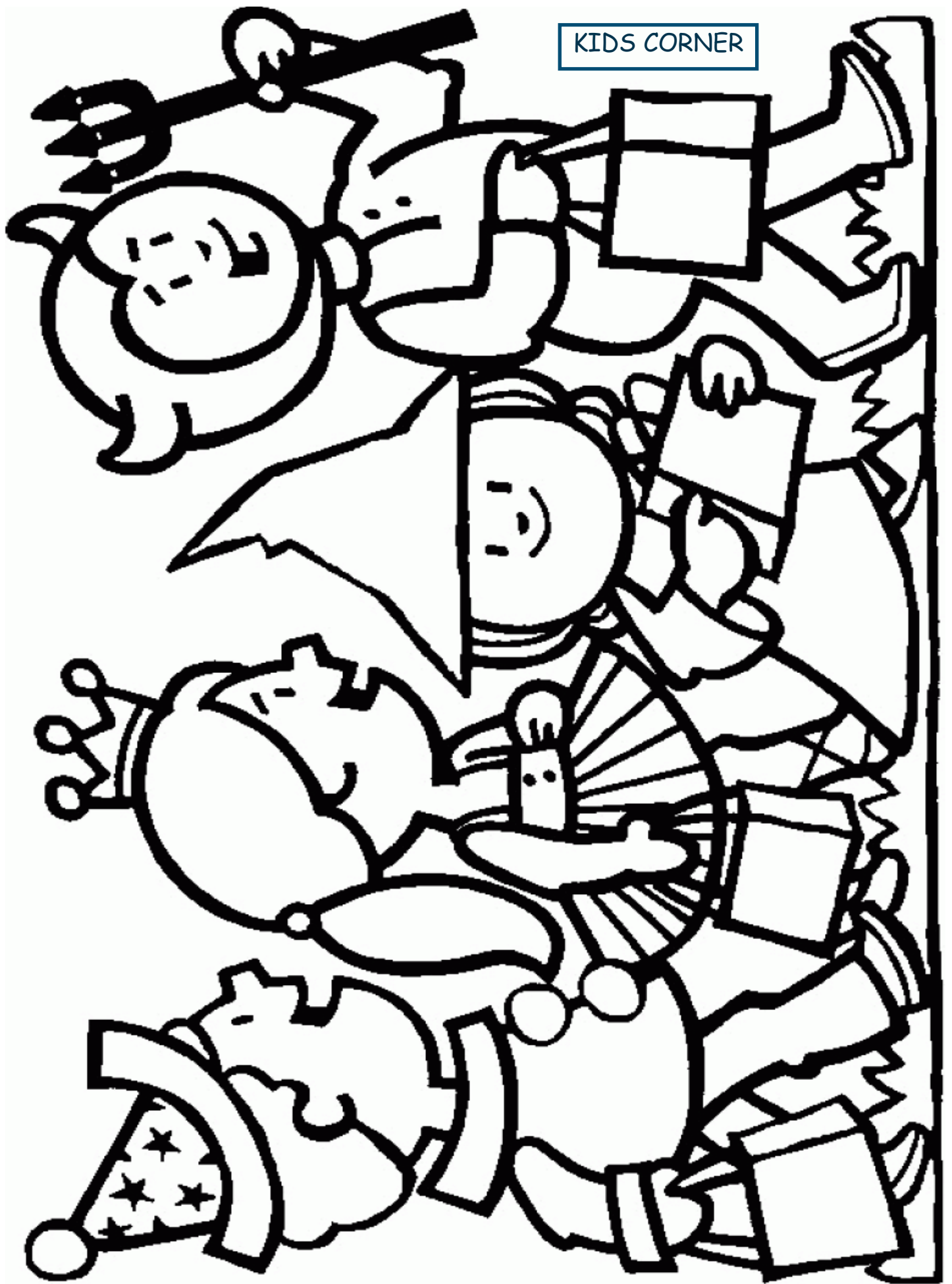

Dial 8-1-1 **BEFORE digging!**

Before anyone decides to dig a hole, even on their own property, they are required to contact Texas811 (<https://www.texas811.org/homeowner>), which is the national “call-before-you-dig” number. By calling 811, they will schedule a *free* locate to mark or flag the approximate area where utilities are buried so they are not accidentally damaged. If a person digs and damages a water pipe (or other utility) without calling 811 first, they may be responsible for all costs due to the damage.

How to Locate a Leak:

Creedmoor-Maha WSC kindly asks its members to assist in keeping an eye out for any leaks on their property. Notifying CMWSC of leaks helps provide the necessary safe water to its members. CMWSC members may also receive \$50.00 off the next months’ water utility bill for reporting a qualified water leak within its CCN boundaries.

It is important to know that the property owner is responsible for any leaks located between the water meter to the home. Water leaks located from the water meter to the street, is the responsibility of CMWSC.

How to find or locate a leak at your home:

- Keep an eye on your water meter. [If all water is turned off and the meter is still running, you may have a water leak.]
- Check your bill for changes in water usage.
